 "I've never seen a band give so much in every single concert that they play," Allin said.
 And Seth Avett said he doesn't expect the energy in this show to be any different from others.
 He said the band brings the same intensity to an intimate show as they do to a show at the largest venue they've ever played.
 "Each night is different. Every single night has its own personality, its own memories, its own spontaneity," Seth Avett said. "I'm sure this one will be no different."
 The Avett Brothers are North Carolina natives, currently residing in Concord.
 Avett said living in a small town in North Carolina has created a stability that is reflected in the band's music.
 Their newest album, "The Second Gleam," was ranked 10th on the Billboard Top Independent Albums chart in August.
 Though they've gained national attention, the band has been playing at local venues like Cat's Cradle, The Cave and Local 506 for about eight years.
 "The energy is just so on the forefront and so everywhere," Seth Avett said. "As soon as you pull into town, you can just feel the energy."
 Adele Ricciardi, CUAB music committee chairwoman, said the band helps contribute to the type

of diversity CUAB wants to bring this year.
 "We at CUAB do music nonstop and we kind of look for artists that are upcoming," she said.
 Allin said The Avett Brothers also have a better name recognition than last year's Homecoming act, Augustana.
 "It's kind of a name that you can just say and people can list off a number of their songs," he said. "They're a style of music that doesn't come to UNC often, so I was excited when they did."
 Seth Avett said the excitement, energy and electricity that a group of college students brings is priceless.
 And because of this, he said, the group is just as excited to come to Chapel Hill as UNC students are to see The Avett Brothers perform.
 "It's always a pleasure to be there," Seth Avett said.
 "There's anticipation on both sides."

 through a broken nose his sophomore year.
 Hansbrough averaged 22.6 points and 10.2 rebounds last year en route to garnering ACC Player of the Year and National Player of the Year honors.
 Compounding matters is the fact that Marcus Ginyard, who started at small forward in 2008, is already sidelined for six to eight weeks with a

stress fracture in his left foot.
 The announcement comes hard on the heels of North Carolina's preseason unanimous No. 1 ranking, based largely on the strength of all five starters returning.
 Two of those starters are now down for at least the opening portion of the season, opening up opportunities for UNC's talented freshman class.

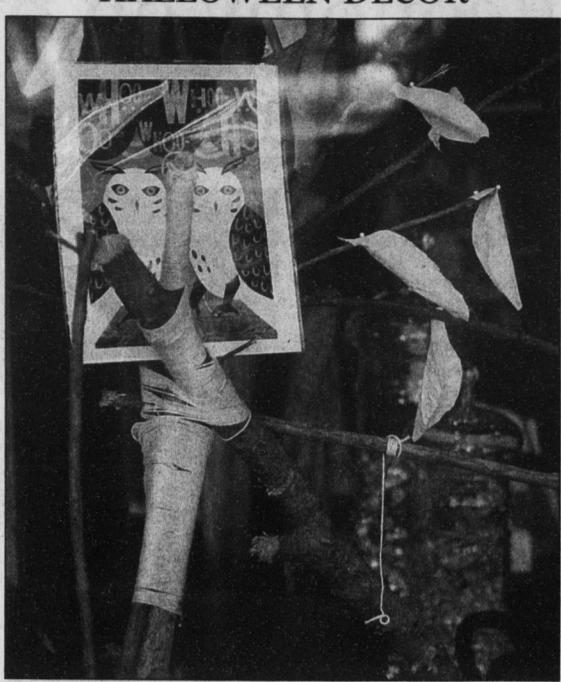

 ASG President Greg Doucette, who is N.C. State University's Senate President, said that although he understands Bowles's concern, he is glad the association addressed the issue early.
 "His concern was that we're making our decision prior to getting all the facts," Doucette said of Bowles's reaction. "What I conveyed to him was that whether or not students can afford the increase is independent of whether increases are justified and needed."
 UNC-Greensboro's delegation voted for a tuition cap different from the one their student body president had lobbied for on the school's tuition task force, whose decision on tuition wasn't final at the time.
 At the ASG meeting, UNC-G passed a 2 percent increase cap, rather than the 6.5 percent cap their university recommended, UNC-G Student Body President

Michael Tuso said.
 "They knew that that was going to be on the table," Tuso said. "For our specific purposes, the delegation used the 2 percent as a symbolic representation."
 Bowles, in the e-mail to Gage, cited that discrepancy as an example of why ASG may have acted too soon.
 "I don't think it can be classified as a failure if the association is advocating for what the students want," Tuso said.
 Doucette said the association was simply fulfilling its duty to represent UNC-system students.
 "I stand by my opinion to the board, to the President, and to anyone in the association that our product is valid," he said.
 "I have little doubt that what they see now would have been they would have seen had we adopted this in January."

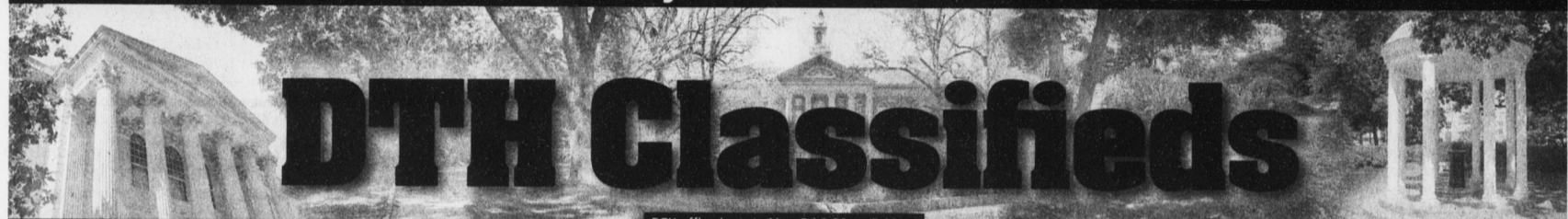
