campaign had started to take note. The two students then became part of a statewide grassroots effort to campaign for McCrory on college campuses.

Since Aug. 15, Hutson has been strictly in charge of campaigning for Pat McCrory at UNC.

But McCrory has worked with Democrats, Hutson said.

"I've really been trying to show people that he can work with people on both sides of the spectrum,"

he said. Hutson said that while other campaigns have been very aggressive with their campaign tactics, he has directed his 15 campaign workers to work differently.

"We're very careful about approaching people who have been approached already," Hutson said. "You don't pester people until they say yes or no. That's not how you inspire people."

Hutson said he believes his team's tactics have been key in how effective their campaign has been.

While Hutson said he has no aspirations to run for office, he said he'd like to campaign again in the

future.

"It's almost a little cheesy to be so passionate about this, going around, shaking hands and telling people why they should vote for someone," Hutson said.

With Election Day tomorrow, Hutson sees the end of his campaign as bittersweet.

"There will definitely be a void to fill. I have about 100 Pat McCrory cozies that I'm not sure what I will do with," he said.

"But I'm so proud of my team, and I'll probably sleep a lot more too."

The bright lights and packed floor in the Exhibition Center made the facility uncomfortably warm, but supporters remained on their feet for the whole rally — despite having been there for several hours.

Joellen Holder, a stay-at-home mom from Clayton, arrived at 2 p.m. with her three young children, waited two hours before being let in and then stood for three more hours waiting for Palin to arrive.

"I feel safer with them," Holder said of the Republican ticket. "Even

though I don't make more than \$250,000, for these people to help support me is unnecessary."

Some were so set on seeing Palin that they stayed despite difficulty dealing with the heat and long hours of standing.

Wake County Emergency Medical Services had to provide medical assistance for 20 to 30 people in the crowd, most of whom fainted or came close to it.

Even nonsupporters acknowledged the celebrity that Palin has crafted.

Eric Duncan, a teacher at Lakeview School in Durham, came toting a McCain-Palin sign but

admitted he had cast a vote earlier that week for Obama. He showed up simply to see Palin.

"It's kind of like watching a car accident," he said.

McCain has consistently been behind in the polls for several weeks, but supporters are keeping their hopes up.

"The media seems to not tell both sides. It might make some people give up," said Tammy Morton, a nurse from Franklin County.

"It's not over 'till it's over. No fat lady sung yet."

McCain relying on voter turnout

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MCT) — When results begin rolling in Tuesday night, look to Florida for early signs of who will be our next president.

As the presidential race enters its final days, Republican presidential candidate Sen. John McCain's best chance for a comeback rests in voter turnout.

To win, he must win nearly all the remaining undecided voters in key swing states and peel a large chunk of "soft" supporters from Democratic presidential candidate Sen. Barack Obama.

Obama could win if he rounds up overwhelming majorities in the Democratic stronghold of South Florida and inspires a huge turnout from blacks and younger voters in the state.

Federal bailout plan has changed, now will help beyond Wall Street

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MCT) — The Bush administration's \$700 billion Wall Street rescue plan to purchase distressed mortgages and other bad assets has morphed over time.

Today the Emergency Economic Stabilization Plan, signed by President Bush on Oct. 3, involves the government taking direct equity stakes in banks, with at least one bank using the money to buy

a rival bank. The taxpayer money also is expected to be used to buy stakes in life insurance companies, and may soon even go to help two struggling automakers merge.

In short, what once was referred to as a bailout for Wall Street now looks like a broader bailout of all sorts of troubled businesses. Some lawmakers and outside analysts question whether that's serving the public interest as intended.

Reid says Stevens is not welcome

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MCT) — Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid said Sunday that Sen. Ted Stevens, R-Alaska, cannot remain a senator even if he's re-elected Tuesday because he's a convicted felon.

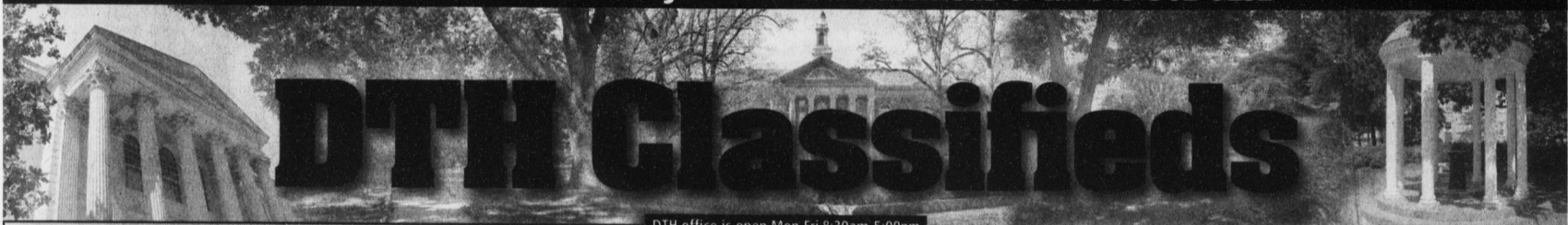
Stevens was convicted last week in federal court on seven felony counts of failing to report gifts and services. Stevens has continued to campaign for re-election, even as he maintains his innocence.

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MCT) — The U.S. Supreme Court will consider Tuesday whether fleeting swear words on national television merit punishment.

One side warns of dangerously loosened morals, the other side of the creeping hand of censorship. But the Federal Communications Commission v. Fox Television Stations stands to be the most influential First Amendment case in the 2008-09 term.
