WASHINGTON, D.C. (MCT) Democrats added another Senate seat Thursday when they managed a victory in Oregon, leaving only three contests undecided.

Democrat Jeff Merkley, a state legislator, defeated two-term Republican Sen. Gordon Smith by about 40,000 votes. Smith called Merkley to concede.

Democrats will control 57 of the Senate's 100 seats, still short of a filibuster-proof 60-vote majority, which would enable them to move their agenda more easily.

Blacks, Latinos crucial to Prop. 8

SAN JOSE, Calif. (MCT) -Even as black and Latino voters were a powerful force in boosting America's first black president to victory, in California they also were crucial to passing Proposition 8, a ballot measure labeled, "Eliminates right of same-sex couples to marry."

Exit polls showed that 70 percent of black voters, and a majority of Latino voters, voted yes on Proposition 8, one likely reason why the measure won a slim majority in Los Angeles County, where pre-election polls had suggested it would lose.


