Jewelry from Jesus' day

A 2,000-year-old golden earring — with three pearls and two emeralds — has been found under a parking lot adjacent to the city of old Jerusalem. The artifact dates back to the time of Christ, during the Roman period.

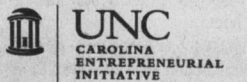
