not have the authority to interpret the Student Code.

"We're asking that you refine the Board of Elections' job," Klein said to the court. "They should administer decisions passed by yourselves and explicitly spelled out in the code."

The board argued that their

administrative rulings are guide-lines for the board to follow, not interpretations of the code.

"The BOE is left with a lot of undefined terms," said Val Tenyotkin, vice chairman of the elections board.
"All of these things must be decided on a case-by-case basis."

Tenyotkin argued that the board is clarifying existing passages in the
