Man clubs with poultry

A man used a frozen turkey to club somebody attempting to carjack a woman at a North Carolina grocery store Sunday morning.

Police said a 30-year-old Raleigh man stole money from a BP gas station before running across the street to a Harris Teeter, where he beat a woman and tried to take her car.

Other shoppers came to the rescue.
