ORGANIZATION OF THE COMMERCIAL NEWS PUBLISHING COMPANY.—The permanent organization of the Commercial News Publishing Company was effected at the Board of Trade Rooms last night. There are just fifty subscribers to the capital stock, which is limited to \$5,000, and the company begins operations with \$1,500 capital stock paid in, to be increased at pleasure.

The Commercial News Company represents entirely a business element in New Berne, and there are no distinctions as regards political affiliation. The object and the understanding is that we are to have a newspaper here that shall be entirely free from partisan bias, and one which, while presenting all the true issues before the country, shall discuss and deal with all public questions from the standpoint of actual practical business.

T. A. Green, Esq., one of the prominent and leading business men of the city, was chosen President of the Company; Mr. C. H. Blank, another, Vice President, and Jas. F. Clark, Esq., still another of our commercial men, was selected for Secretary and Treasurer. Messrs. Clement Manly, C. E. Foy, Geo. Allen and E. H. Meadows were elected to the Directory; and Messrs. K. R. Jones, Alex. Miller and J. W. Moore were chosen for the finance committee.

The organization of this Company gives an earnest of the determination on the part of the commercial people of New Berne to perpetuate a stable and efficient newspaper at this great and growing business centre, and when fifty of the representative men of the place, representing all elements of business, come together in an enterprise of this sort, it assures success.

This undertaking comprehends the merging of the Nut Shell into the Commercial News, and an enlarged and generally improved paper.

The new arrangement will go into effect the first of January.
