Wilmington and Weldon Railroad, STOCKHOLDERS MEETING.

The Stockholders met in the Court House at 11 o'clock this forenoon, and organized by calling Owen R. Kean, Esq., of Duplin, to the Chair, and appointing John N. Washington and Patrick Murphy, Esqrs., as Secretaries.

The report of the President and Directors was read by Hon. Wm. S. Ashe, President. From the report of the President and Directors and accompanying report of the Engineer and Superintendent, we learn that the total receipts of the company for the year ending Sept. 30th, 1858, have been \$446,583.30.

The main falling off in the receipts has occurred in the department of through travel, and to this result a number of causes have contributed. The depression of the business of the country restricting travel—the opening up of rival lines, and perhaps more than either, the difficulty if not impossibility of keeping up a through ticket arrangement between this point and New York.

The first English debt of the Company falling due this year, has been arranged by the payment of one-third in cash and an extension of time upon the balance.

Upon the whole, we cannot but regard the showing as highly satisfactory; indeed, we know that several gentlemen highly interested in the road, were most agreeably surprised on finding the exhibit was so good, since it is known that there has been hardly a Railroad Company in the country that has kept clear of difficulties during the past year of panic and embarrassment.

Of course, the favorable balance between receipts and expenditures has only been obtained through the exercise of rigid economy. For some years past large expenditures have necessarily been made for the erection of new depot buildings, warehouses, bridges, etc., as well as the filling up of trestle-work.

Major O. R. Kean holds the proxy for the State, and Wm. S. Mullins, Esq., represents the amount of stock held by the Wilmington and Manchester Railroad Company.—Journal of Thursday.

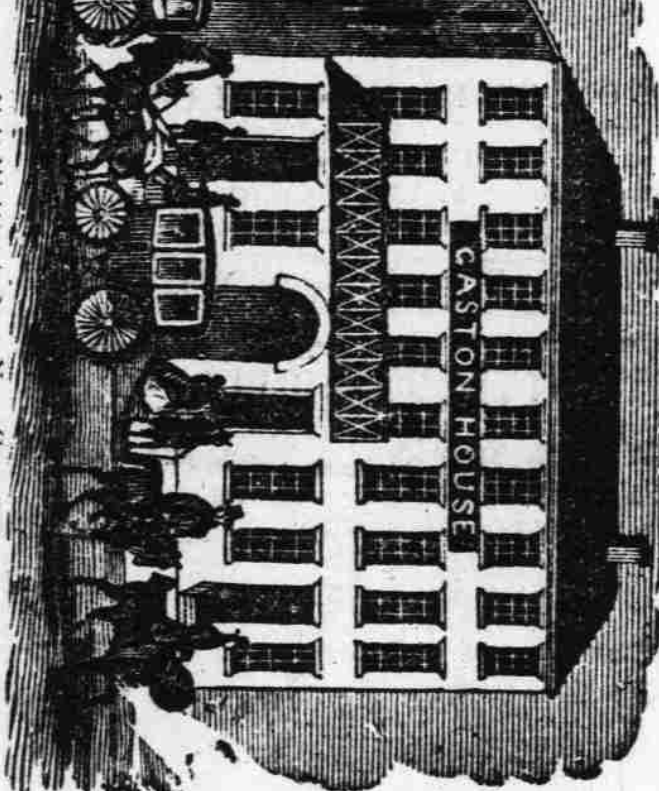
