LEGISLATURE OF N. CAROLINA.

FRIDAY, Nov. 25. Mr. Boyd introduced a bill to provide for the running and marking of the dividing line between this State and Virginia.

Mr. Thomas, a bill to authorize County Courts to establish or abolish jury trials, subject to restriction as to time in the change.

Mr. Houston, a bill to provide for the procurement of evidence against faro banks. [Intended to amend the statute on this subject by enabling the authorities to summon persons and swear them.]

Mr. Turner's bill to abolish the freehold qualification of jurors was defeated on the second reading by 26 to 14.

No other business of importance to the general reader. Adjourned.

HOUSE OF COMMONS.

The House assembled at 11 o'clock. The following new bills were introduced and referred Mr. Kerr, to settle cheaply and expeditiously questions arising out of the Revenue Laws.

Mr. Foy to prevent Down Easters and all other persons, not citizens of Onslow county, from fishing with seines in New River, Onslow county, Mr. H. C. Jones, to amend 40 section 31, chap. Revenue Code. Mr. McKay, to authorize the majority of acting justices of Cumberland county to appoint a Special Term. Mr. Benbury, to repeal as much of 8 section 81 chap. of Revised Code, concerning Fish, as relates to the county of Tyrrell. Mr. Stephens, to establish a Freehold Homestead and for other purposes. Dr. Lane, to charter the Savannah Mining and Manufacturing Company. Mr. Dancy to amend the Constitution so as to make Jews eligible to office. The following bills were read the second time: The bill to aid in the construction of the Western Railroad was made the order of the day for Thursday next. The bill to open the Yadkin and Pee Dee Rivers was made the order of the day for Monday next. The bill to incorporate the White Oak River Navigation Company, and concerning Notia River, Cherokee county, passed their second readings. The bill to extend the corporate limits of Kinston, Lenoir county, was after some debate, laid on the table. The bill to pay the Talles Jurors of McDowell county, was indefinitely postponed. The bill to incorporate the Arundell Hotel Company, passed its second reading. A message was received from the Governor relative to erecting a National Monument in Philadelphia. Sent to the Senate with a proposition to raise a joint committee. The House adjourned.

ARREST OF TWO RABBI.—Great Excitement Among the Jews.—The Jews who were arrested yesterday, said the New York Day Book of the 25th ult., on the complaint of Aaron Friedman, killer of cattle, as agents of the Prussian, Hamburg and Saxon Lottery, were brought before the Mayor this morning for examination, and held to bail each in the sum of \$1,000 to appear at the General Sessions. The parties arrested gave their names as Pasca Rosenthal, residing at No. 70 Norfolk street, Abram Joseph Asch, of No. 68 Allen street, and Moses Levy, of No. 383 Broome street. Asch and Rosenthal are both Rabbi. Asch being the general agent for distributing the tickets of this lottery in this country. He was arrested while teaching the Jews in the Synagogue.

Their arrest caused a great sensation among the Jews, and from the appearance this morning half of Chatham street was in attendance before the Mayor. They all say that Friedman (who was also a Jew) had better have against their throats than made a complaint against their friends, as such a thing was never before known in the Jewish Church and they hold up their hands in holy horror at the traitor.
