**OLD NORTH STATE NEWS IN SHORT PARAGRAPHS**

Raleigh, Dec. 6.—Tobacco growers of the state tonight, in a telegram addressed to the North Carolina members of the senate and house of representatives in Congress, point out that they are in the most disastrous situation in their history and urge that legislation be enacted to save them from financial ruin.

Charlotte, Dec. 4.—Organization of a \$225,000 housing corporation, with virtually unlimited resources, was announced here today by George Stephens, banker, who said the company proposed to construct houses of medium quality as rapidly as they can be sold to "responsible persons" on "easy terms."

Chapel Hill, Dec. 4.—After three quarters of desperately hard playing with both teams gaining frequently but neither able to score, Chapel Hill surged forward in the fourth quarter, scored two touch downs and won the high school championship of North Carolina for the second year in succession by defeating Monroe here today, 14 to 0.

Winston-Salem, Dec. 5.—The local tobacco association, at a meeting Saturday, decided to close the warehouses on Friday, December 10th, for the Christmas holidays, and to re-open on Tuesday, January 4, 1921. The closing this year is nearly two weeks earlier than usual. The decision for an early closing was unanimous on the part of the members of the association attending the meeting. No tobacco will be received after the 10th.

Goldsboro, Dec. 5.—Five negroes, guarded by 100 machine gunners all day during their trial for the murder of Herman Jones, a country merchant, were tonight found guilty by the jury of first degree murder in the cases of Caldwell and Foster and George Pearsall, James Hill and Henry Williams, of second degree murder Judge Devin sentenced Caldwell and Foster to the electric chair January 7 and the three others to 20 years each in the state penitentiary.

Lenoir, Dec. 5.—Whether or not Lenoir is to have four trains a day or two trains a day will come before the corporation commission next Thursday, December 9. General Manager L. T. Nichols, of the C. & N. W. Railroad company notified local town officials a week ago that trains No. 34 and 55, mixed passenger and freight trains, running between Elizabethton and Hickory, would be discontinued between Lenoir and Hickory. Local authorities immediately took the matter up with the corporation commission and yesterday a notice was received of a hearing on December 9.

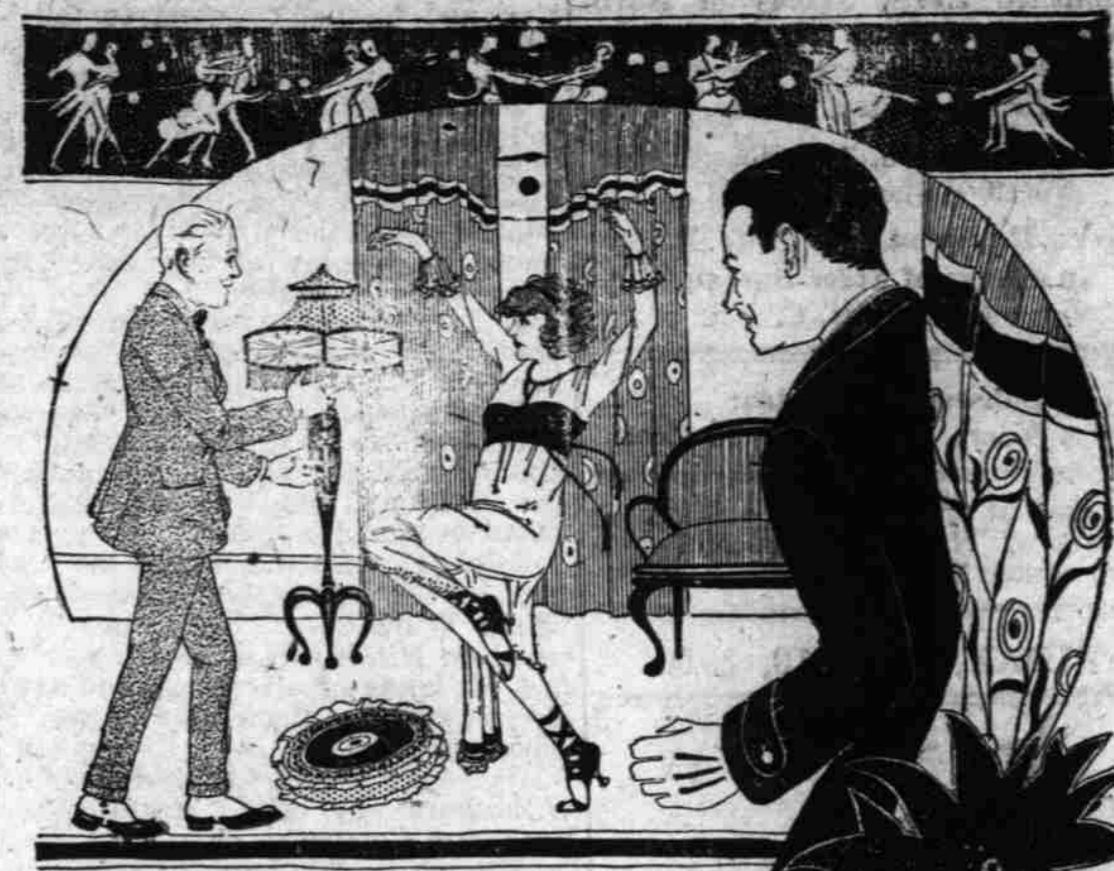
Statesville, Dec. 4.—A bold but unsuccessful attempt to hold up and rob the mail car on train No. 16, from Asheville to Salisbury, due to arrive here at 9 p. m., was made by two highwaymen last night. The would-be robbers are thought to have boarded the train at Newton, and began their attempts to break into the car after the train had passed Catawba station, 10 miles west of here. Mail Clerk Poovey said the robbers tried to prize the door open, but failed to do so. When the train began to slow up for the station here the would-be robbers swung off the train and disappeared in the darkness.

Statesville, Dec. 3.—A murder occurred this afternoon at 1:15 o'clock at Mooresville when Hoyt Mercer, aged about 18 years, shot and killed Berry Rhinehardt, aged 28. The participants in this homicide were employees of the Mooresville cotton mills and the tragedy took place in the weave room of mill No. 3. It seems that the two men had some words this morning and this afternoon young Mercer, it is alleged, walked in the room where Rhinehardt was at work and shot him twice with a .22 rifle, the first bullet taking effect in his neck and the second in the back as the wounded man started to run.

Raleigh, Dec. 5.—Persistent rumors that members of the international reform bureau, the national anti-vice squad or a similar organization having for its purpose the purification of cities in the United States are visiting in the capital city this week cannot be verified. First intimation that Raleigh had been placed on the list of southern cities due for renovation by the crusaders was made here last week by Rev. Sam Small, who spoke at a local church and among other things said: "This old town is going to be cleaned up pretty soon." Reference was made by Mr. Small to crusaders against all forms of vice comprehended by the national organization in all sections of the country within a short time. Washington dispatches to North Carolina papers early during last week corroborated the preacher's statement in part as to proposed campaign in this state, although no announcement was made as to dates.

Athens, Greece, (Associated Press.)—The president held today has shown an overwhelming majority in favor of the retention of King Constantine.

Duke, Dec. 6.—H. T. Patterson, aged 46, president of the Bank of Coats, at Coats, six miles from here, committed suicide this morning. Financial worries are assigned as the cause. Mr. Patterson slipped from his house at 2 o'clock this morning and was found by members of his family about sunrise in a barn with a bullet wound over the heart. A pistol was found by his side. He was the cashier for seven years and president for the past year. A run was made on the bank by citizens two weeks ago and the bank closed last Saturday. It was rumored a receiver was to have been appointed. The bank has been in shaky condition for two weeks.

Petersburg, Va., Dec. 5.—According to a report brought to this city last night by a Keyville, Prince Edward county resident, the Bank of Keyville was robbed early Saturday morning and \$8,000 in Liberty bonds taken.
