

PRITCHARD'S PROSPECT

Expects North Carolina to Go Republican.

SO SAY THE LESSER LIGHTS

McKinley is to Be Renominated for President and White Tar Heels Will Vote for Him—Charley McKesson's Mouth Waters for Pie.

Correspondence of The Morning Post. Washington, Jan. 16.—Senator Pritchard left here this afternoon with the Dingley funeral party for Maine.

Senator Pritchard looks forward confidently to North Carolina casting her electoral vote for the Republican candidate in 1900. It is conceded that McKinley will be the candidate of his party.

Among Democrats, the same view as to candidates and platform is entertained, and it must be admitted that some do not hesitate to express fears of the result in the Tar Heel State. Judge Fleming, assistant secretary of the Democratic Congressional Committee, said to the Post correspondent yesterday that he felt grave doubts about the political future of North Carolina.

Senator Pritchard, in the meantime, is doing quietly all he can to strengthen his party in the appointments in the State. He does not confine them to members of his own party, but where he finds a Populist or a Republican leaning, he does not hesitate to put them in office. He is trusted implicitly by the President in these matters and the President expects that, from the Federal patronage, sent down now in 1900, a rich Republican harvest will follow.

C. F. McKesson, of Morganton, is heard of Mr. McKesson is hot on the trail of a foreign consul and is not very particular where he is sent. Just so he is sent soon—the sooner the better.
