

Henry Stephens' Career as a Bloter Probably Closed - Soldlers Take Control of the Town-Martial Law Declared.

Pana, Ill., April 10 .- Henry Stephens, the giant negro miner who led last September's rict, precipitated another clash this morning between white miners and imported negroes which resuffed in killing of soven and wounding of eight. Two of the dead are whites, four colored men and one negeo woman. Several of the wounded may die.

The trouble occurred on the principal business street, which was crowdcd. Stephens was parading the street armed and defying arrest. He attemptd to shoot the sheriff, whereupon sevcial deputies opened fire. Stephenst sen, shooting indiscriminately and killing an innocent onlooker. Following Stephens' arrest, negroes began shooting in every section of the city, but chiefly with rifles from towiff collected a posse and set about to restore order.
