COTTON. New York, Sept. 26.—Cotton prices again moved upward under the spur of higher cables, the bullish weekly government report, persistent Southern buying and covering of shorts for local and foreign account. Notices for 8,000 bales were issued, but they were only a drop in the bucket and had no effect. Light frost predicted for Alabama, Tennessee and Mississippi had a certain sentimental effect, though it may do no particular harm. Later on the curb was applied to the advance in heavy realizing sales, and besides Liverpool sold considerable of the late months against purchases at the South. So great is the bullish enthusiasm at the South, some express fear that that section may yet have two crops to sell—one that is raised and one that it bought. But the bull side is more popular than a while ago, and some enthusiasts go so far as to predict 8 cents at no very distant day.
