Manila, March 15 .- The troops who went to reinforce the garrison at Gubat, fifty-two miles from Albay, found the men unhurt. It had been reported that the garrison was surrounded by insurgents and the town was burning.

The people made an attack on a swindling foreigner, whose warehouses were burned. The fire spread to other buildings, and this attracted the insurgents to the place. When the people saw the rebels coming they stampeded to the ships. The rebels, who were chiefly bolomen, were easily repulsed by the Americans.
