Mr. Sam Vance Talks Interestingly of Conditions and Prospects

Mr. Sam F. Vance, deputy clerk of the Forsyth county Superior Court and State secretary for the Junior Order United American Mechanics, spent several hours in the city yesterday and left for his home in Winston-Salem on the afternoon train. Mr. Vance says that Winston never had brighter prospects for a big horse show and county fair than she has for the one this year. The twin city, Mr. Vance says, is making more rapid strides in her industrial development than ever before in her history. Many new buildings are going up, notably a mammoth establishment to be occupied by the Glimmer Wholesale Dry Goods Company recently incorporated with a \$150,000 capital stock. CORPORATION COMMISSION

Two or Three Railroads Liable to \$500 Fines

Mr. H. C. Brown, the efficient clerk of the North Carolina Corporation Commission, said yesterday that two or three of the railroad companies in the State have as yet failed to submit their annual reports up to June 1, as required by law. The commission is required by law to impose a fine of \$500 on every company failing to do so, and unless the reports are forthcoming very soon a fine will have to be imposed. There was no business transacted by the Corporation Commission yesterday. Chairman Franklin McNeill went to Wilmington yesterday to spend Sunday, and will return Monday for business sessions of the commission to be held this week.

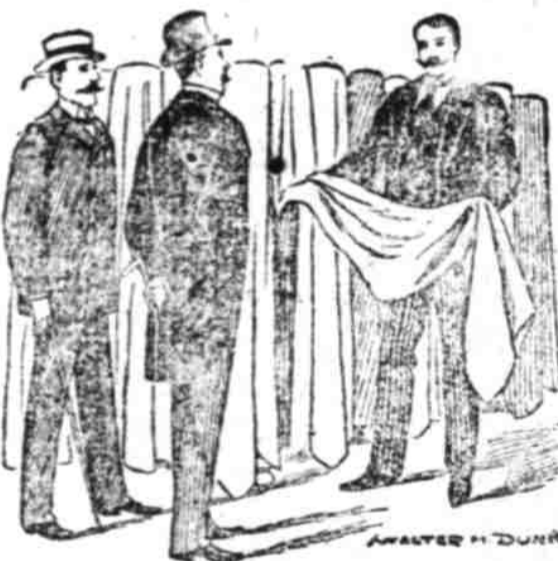
