### EXPLORATIONS IN CITY OF KALDA

#### Dr. Penniman Describes Results of Recent Research Among the World's Ancient Cities

Dr. J. H. Penniman of the University of Pennsylvania last evening lectured to a large audience on "Recent Explorations in Babylon." Dr. Penniman was introduced by Dr. H. A. Royster, an alumnus of the distinguished institution which the speaker represents.1

In the course of his lecture Dr. Penniman explained that thirteen years ago the University of Pennsylvania obtained permission from the Turkish government for their archaeologists to excavate the ancient city of Kalda in Mesopotania, located near the Euphrates, in what is low territory of Turkey. This work has been steadily carried on, but at the present rate a hundred years will be taken to complete this undertaking. Kalda is
