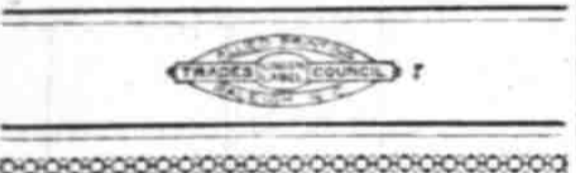

Referring to the proposed measure to regulate Child Labor and the hours of labor of others the Charlotte Textile Excelsior says:

"Closely allied with the child labor law is a proposition to regulate the hours of labor in manufacturing plants to eleven hours during the day and ten at night. The stoutest opposition to this measure is liable to come from the wage earners rather than from the employers."

"Ought not any movement intended to affect the privileges of grown men and women be subject at least to their consideration, their approval or disapproval? The impression seems to be that this demand for regulation comes entirely from the wage-earners, in behalf of their protection from the over-bearing employer."

"The Atlanta Journal demands 'a million-dollar federal building—or nothing.' That is right, so long as somebody else will, or may be made to, foot the bill. Atlanta ought to have a building commensurate with the need of its government at that place, not only for the present but for some years; but whether it ought necessarily to cost one million dollars is another question."
