Changing Congressmen

(Norfolk Virginian-Pilot.) Speaking of the tendency of Southern constituencies to change their representatives in Congress, the Petersburg Index-Appel says: "A good man in Congress, in House or Senate, gains influence by length of service. No new man, in either body, has the knowledge of his duties, the personal and intimate acquaintance with his associates, the committee appointments, that give him strength. Time is required for all these, and therefore, for usefulness to the man's constituents and to the country. It is not too much to say, also, that, especially to Southern men of this generation, and education in Congress by prolonged association with men representative of other sections is most desirable and most valuable. We do not mean that Virginia ideas of Democracy are antiquated, or that Virginia people are in any way more than others deficient in general knowledge of public affairs. The law Congressmen is as much lost as a yearling steer in a strange herd. He commands practically no weight in committees and is never heard on the floor of the House unless he has a friend who has the Speaker's ear. Yet Southern constituencies seem really to prefer new men. Not so the North and West. It seems there to be understood that the
