

### SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Oath of Office Administered to Hon. J. Y. Joyner by Graham Haywood, J. P.

The oath of office was administered to Hon. J. Y. Joyner for his second term as superintendent of public instruction yesterday afternoon by Mr. Graham Haywood, who is a justice of the peace. The ceremony was in the governor's office, in the presence of Governor Aycock and the state officers. Three oaths were administered, as prescribed by the Code, as follows: "I, James Y. Joyner, do solemnly swear that I will support the constitution of the United States, so help me, God. J. Y. JOYNER. "Sworn to and subscribed before me, this 29th day of January, 1903. "GRAHAM HAYWOOD, J. P. "I, James Y. Joyner, do solemnly and sincerely swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to the state of North Carolina and to the constitutional powers and authorities which are or may be established for the government thereof; and that I will endeavor to support, maintain and defend the constitution of said state, not inconsistent with the constitution of the United States to the best of my knowledge and ability; so help me, God. J. Y. JOYNER. "Sworn to and subscribed before me, this 29th day of January, 1903. "GRAHAM HAYWOOD, J. P. "I, J. Y. Joyner, do solemnly swear that I will well and truly execute the duties of the office of superintendent of public instruction according to the best of my ability, according to law; so help me, God.
