THREE IMPORTANT CHARTERS GRANTED

The Secretary of State issued charters to three new corporations yesterday and recorded an increase of capital for another, the Hines Bros. Lumber Co., of Kinston, which increases from \$50,000 to \$100,000. The High Point Electric Power Co. was chartered, with \$20,000 capital subscribed and \$50,000 authorized. The incorporators are A. N. Richardson, J. B. Richardson, W. S. Thomas. The Statesville Hotel Co. is incorporated, with \$10,000 subscribed and \$25,000 authorized. Incorporators: J. W. Gray, Sig. Wallace, H. P. Holland, E. G. Guthrie, Isadore Wallace, E. Moonson, D. M. Ausley, Herman Wallace, Jas. F. Insom, H. F. Long, C. H. and Will Lester. The third company chartered is the Western North Carolina Mining and Developing Co. of Boyer, Alleghany county. The company will develop what is known as the "Native Copper and Lead Mines," owned by N. R. Williams, the strata being said in the articles of agreement to be 769 feet long and 200 feet wide. The capital stock is \$25,000.
