May declined eighteen points at one time and H. S. LEARD, T. P. A., it looked as though bulls were selling May cotton. The weak stock market, the strike in Lowell and approaching planting season all operated against the cotton market. Liverpool broke sharply and this brought the sellers here. There was, more real bear taik than we have heard in some time. Every one was against the market for the time being at least. Pressure was all along the line, being greatest in the old crop months. There was a general feeling that the market would be larger this coming month than during April of last year, when receipts were only about 350,000 bales. Then, too, the visible supply ran down sharply last year at this time, decreasing some 600,000 bales between this and May 3rd. Under this view of things we would continue to sell August on every rally. There is nothing in the present outlook to put prices up very much and the tendency of the market should be towards a lower rather than a higher level. We do not want to sell cotton on breaks. On a break in the morning cover shorts. On a rally of ten points we would sell moderately. We think the chort side of August on bulges is safer than the long side of any option. 
