

THE STOCK MARKET

Prices Rose Easily on Early Dealings and Then Sagged—There Were Advances Later, but the Close Was Inactive

New York, July 6.—Light buying orders carried prices upward, but the gains did not exceed half a point except in the case of United States Steel.

Stocks rose rather easily as the session progressed on small buying. St. Paul, Missouri Pacific and United States Steel stocks were most in demand among the active leaders.

Prices sagged off after buying orders had been executed. United States Steel stocks lost their rise. There were gains of 1/4 in Lackawanna and a point in C. C. & St. Louis, Minneapolis, St. Paul & Sault Ste Marie.
