

THE STOCK MARKET

Prices Broke Badly at Opening, but Rallied After the Storm Subsided—Losses More Than Wiped out Before the Close

New York, Dec. 13.—Wall street's opening prices of stocks today broke with great violence with the exception of support for Amalgamated Copper, which was lifted a point over last night...

The determined support of Amalgamated Copper, which lifted it 3 points over last night, induced a rush to cover on the part of the bears, and violent rallies ensued, which extended all through the list and were of very substantial proportions...

With the exception of 1-3-8 in Amalgamated Copper, prices wavered. With renewed support for that stock the market steadied again. Further progress was made in repairing the early inroads in prices, which were practically restored...

The absence of new pressure of stock encouraged renewed bidding up, and top prices were made for Pennsylvania, Tennessee Coal and United States Steel stocks. Additional over-night gains reached 1 to 1-1/4 in Pennsylvania, St. Paul, Wabash, United States Steel and Tennessee Coal.

The United States Steel stocks brought 28 and 88 1/2 respectively, and Union Pacific touched 103 1/2. Occasional reductions occurred during the afternoon, but the general tendency was still upward.
