

Weather Conditions

The eastern area of high barometer has moved to the northeast and is now central off the New England coast, causing cooler weather throughout New England. The western high now dominates the entire west from the Mississippi river to the Pacific coast producing colder weather at all stations except those on the Pacific coast. Between these two highs is an area of low barometer extending from the Great Lakes to the gulf, with the lowest barometer at Meridian. This low will move east causing rain and warmer weather in this vicinity tonight and Wednesday, which will be followed by cooler temperatures. Killing frost was reported at North Platte, Denver and Salt Lake City. No unseasonably low temperatures occurred in the cotton belt during the past twenty-four hours. Rains occurred in nearly all the southern states and in the upper Mississippi valley.
