A PROCLAMATION.

THE RETURNS of the election of Electors of President and V. President of the U. S., held on the Tuesday next after the first Monday of November instant, it being the 7th day of the month, the time appointed by the act of Congress, and in conformity with the regulations of the Statutes of the State, have been received at the Executive Office, from the Sheriffs of the Several Counties, (Yancey only excepted) within the period prescribed by Law.

And the same having been collated, to ascertain the result of said Election, it is found to be as follows, that to-wit: KENNETH RAYNER, HENRY W. MILLER, WILLIAM H. WASHINGTON, GEORGE DAVIS, JOHN WINSLOW, JOHN KERR, RAWLEY GALLOWAY, JAMES W. OSBORNE, TODD R. CALDWELL, and JOHN BAXTER, each received Forty three Thousand Four Hundred and twenty one votes EDWARD STANLEY, Forty three Thousand four Hundred and nineteen votes.

And THOMAS BRAGG, Jr., ASA BIGGS, PERRIN BUSBEE, GEO. S. STEPHENSON, SAMUEL J. PEBSON, CADWALLADER JONES Sr., JAMES L. CLEMMONS, and WILLIAM W. AVERY, each received Thirty-four thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-nine votes.

WILLIAM S. ASHE, and GREEN W. CALDWELL, Thirty-four thousand Eight hundred and Sixty-eight votes, JESSE R. WEAVER, Thirty-four thousand Six Hundred and Forty-one votes, WILLIAM H. THOMAS, Two Hundred and Thirty-seven votes, and eleven other persons Sixty-one votes each, and seven others ten votes each.

ANTIQUE.—Nineveh was 15 miles by nine, and 40 round, with walls 100 feet high, and thick enough for three chariots abreast.

The temple Diana, at Ephesus, was four hundred and twenty five feet high, to support the roof. It was two hundred years in building.

The largest of the pyramids is 480 feet high, and 653 feet on the side, its base covers eleven acres. The stones are about thirty feet in length, and the layers are 208. 360,000 men were employed in its erection.

The labyrinth of Egypt contains 3,000 chambers and 12 halls. Thebes in Egypt, presents ruins 27 miles round. It had one hundred gates. Carthage was 25 miles around. Athens was 25 miles around, all contained 250,000 citizens, and 400,000 slaves.

The temple of Dalphos was so rich in donations, that it was once plundered of 100,000 sterling, and Nero carried from it 200 statute.

The wall of Rome were 13 miles. Babylon was sixty miles within the walls which were seventy five feet thick, and 300 feet high, with one hundred brazen gates.
