

NEWS OF THE STATE.

Wilmington is making an effort to organize a battalion of naval reserves.

The catalogue of Guilford college, session '21 and '22, is out and shows a creditable number of students during the past session.

The third party people in Guilford county will hold a meeting at Summerfield to day to decide upon putting out a county ticket.

The Buncombe county alliance meets at Asheville to-day. An address will be delivered on this occasion by State Auditor Sanderlin.

A man at Kings Mountain, has a Jersey heifer, 19 months old, that has never had a calf, but gives about one and a half gallons of milk a day.

The catalogue of the Liberty High school and business institute is out for the session of '21 and '22. It shows a matriculation last session of two hundred and fifty-two students.

The Marion Record announces the sale of the Charleston, Cincinnati & Chicago railroad, and says that work will be resumed by August 1st on the line between Marion and Johnson City, Tenn.

A new lodge of Odd Fellows is soon to be organized in Wilmington. Application has been made for a charter to Grand Master Jno. D. Bellamy, Jr., and it is probable that the lodge will be instituted some time next week.

The "official" rope for the hanging of Charles Blackman reached the sheriff's office this morning, says the Greensboro Record. It is the same used in the execution of Lige Moore, and has done a similar work for numbers of other poor wretches, notably, two of the Chicago anarchists.

The Lenoir Topic says an old man, unknown to people in the Powelton neighborhood and carrying a rifle and bundle, was stricken by paralysis of the right side in the park near Mr. M. D. Smith's, about two miles from Lenoir, a day or two since, as he was walking toward Wilkesboro.

The Vance Farmer, Vol. 1, No. 1, is before us. It is published at Henderson by a Mr. Rowland and swings the National third party ticket at its masthead. The character of its political discussions can be estimated from a reference to the Chicago convention as "Chicago's Heathenish Monstrosity."

Mr. Walter L. Chamberlain, of Wilmington, conductor of the Richmond division of the A. C. L., met with a sad death yesterday morning while on duty. The Wilmington Star says he was looking out of his caboose near Peterburg as the train he had charge of was running with a hot box, and leaning a little too far out, his head struck against the bridge at Reems' station, killing him instantly.

A burglar visited the residence of Mr. W. T. Croom, corner Eighth and Wooster streets, yesterday morning, says the Wilmington Messenger, but was frightened away before getting into the house. Mrs. Croom happened to the window saw a large negro man through the slats of the window blinds. The window was up and he had his arm through, endeavoring to unfasten the fastenings of the blinds. She screamed and awakened Mr. Croom, and of course, the burglar fled. Mr. Croom ran to the window, threw both blinds open and got a glimpse of the burglar as he fled through the gate.

Prominent Men in Church and State Participate in the W. C. T. U. Conference.

Anderson, of Ohio, who by the way is a brother of Gen. Anderson, of Fort Sumpter fame. Gov. Anderson says this is the brightest spot in the whole country. He has been a regular attendant at these meetings of the W. C. T. U., and says he has never heard the addresses and essays of these ladies excelled in any convention, which is a high compliment to the members of the assembly. Gov. Anderson has also bought property in our town and we trust he will make this his home in the future.

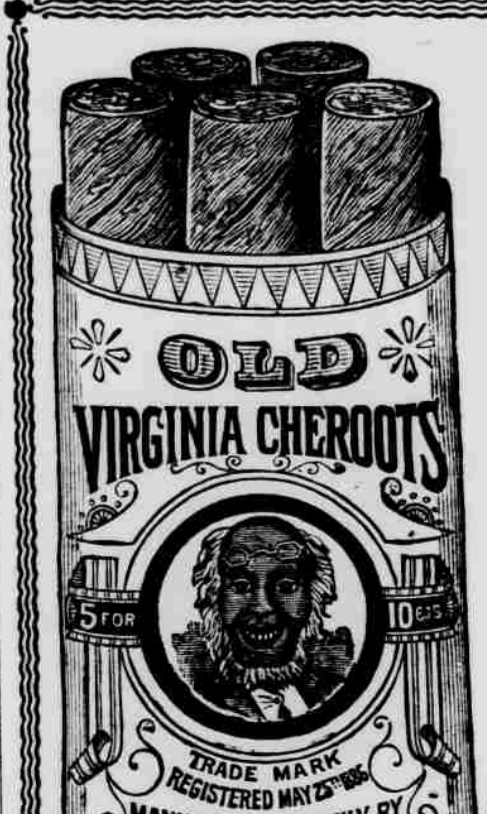
