Terrible Rattroad Accident. By Southern Associated Press.

TYRONE, Pa., May 30 .- This morning a special train on the Tyrone and Clearfield Railroad, composed of Walter Main's circus cars, got beyond control of the trainmen and came down the mountain with fearful rapidity. At Vail station the train was wrecked and animals and men and broken cars were piled up together. Several tigers and lions made their escape and only after the greatest exertion were they recaptured and then not until one of the tigers had killed several domestiic animals in the neighborhood. Six men were killed outright, twelve or fourteen others badly wounded, some of them fatally. The circus is a complete wreck and it will take several days to get property together. The wreck is one of the worst that has occurred on this
