THAT railroad speed is gradually being worked along to a higher point is demonstrated by some interesting facts published by the Baltimore News. A remarkable run has just been made by a special train over the Lake Shore from Chicage to New York, a distance of 98) mile, which averaged for the entire dis tance over fifty-five miles an hour Lust Monday the Empire State express, operated over the New York Central, attempted to cover a distance of 440 miles in 468 minutes. The train did not finish upon the schedule time laid out for it owing to an accident, but showed conclusively that fifty-three and a third miles an hour can be made and maintained. This is about two miles an hour faster than the English rival. Allowing a loss of twentysix minutes due to an accident to the engine, the rua from New York to Buffalo, a distance of 440 miles, including three stops and exclusive of delay, was mate in 494 minutes. This is a world beater, but is nearly equaled by the Royal Blue train which operat a over the Baltimore and Ohio between Washington and New York Allowing for the loss of time due to the slow running of trains in the D strict of Columbia, the City of Baltimore and through Philadelphia and stops, this train averages nearly fifty miles an hour, and has kepthis record up for years. This road holds now and has neld for several years the record for a mile, the distance baving been covered in 84 seconds. The Pennsylvania also ase a record.
