Rapid Growth of Crops

The reports of correspondents of e Weekly Crop Bulletin issued by ie North Carolina Climate and Crop ervice, for the week ending Saturay, May 30th, 1896, are on the whole worable, and indicate, except where rought still prevails, a rapid growth forops. The temperature was bove the normal every day except he 24th, though Friday and Sat arday were also agreeably cool. The rain-fall was unevenly disributed, the north-east portion of the State receiving too much, the west too little. There was generally sufficient sunshine. Cotton and corn especially are in splendid condition tobacco is doing fairly well. The wheat harvest has just commenced. Farmers are beginning to lay by coru in the south portion of the State.

Central District.—In general the past week has been very favorable. The weather war warm, except Friday and Saturday, which were agreeably cool, with plenty of sun shine to make crops grow well. Rain enough has fallen at most places and where it is least, it has been sufficient for such crops as can be worked; there are some few reports of heavy rains washing lands. Cutting wheat has just begun on a limited scale; chinch bugs are numerous at some places. Some correspondents report that oats are coming out considerably since the rains. There is still some tobacco to be transplanted; the crop looks exceeding well. Cotten is now getting grassy; generally good stand and vigorous; chopping continues in north portion. Corn is quite large for the season, and commencing to be laid by in the south. Blackberries are beginning to get ripe in the south portion of the district. Growth of grass in crops requires active at tention of farmers.


