

A NEW ANTISEPTIC.

Experiments With Electroized Salt Water.

The Petit Journal draws attention to a new phase of an important sanitation question. It appears, writes the London Standard Paris correspondent, that Dr. Julien Proger, chief surgeon of the Asylum for Deaf and Dumb Children at Asnières, near Paris, and member of the sanitary council of the department of the Seine, has, for the last four months, been using hermetine as an antiseptic, and that he has now laid the result of his experiments before the Academie de Medecine. It is useful to state how he was led to make those experiments with the electroized salt water used as a disinfectant in the Royal Victoria Hospital at Netley, and as a deodorizer for the main sewer of Ipswich. M. Hermite, the inventor of the sanitary process, had from the first claimed for his electroized salt water power and harmless antiseptic properties, and several years ago supplied Dr. Carlier, of Rouen, and Dr. Chantemesse, of Paris, with bottles of it for surgical and medical purposes. The opinion they expressed was very favorable, so that M. Hermite had no hesitation in continuing to distribute bottles of his specially prepared electroized salt water to friends and acquaintances suffering from wounds, sore throat, sore eyes, etc. It seemed to work marvelous cures, so—Dr. Proger, who happened to hear of some of them, determined to make experiments with the solution, named Hermetine after the name of its inventor. In its communication to the Academie de Medecine he gives a technical report of his clinical experiments, and then sums them up by saying: "The electroized saline water is neither caustic nor irritating; it may be applied to the mucous membrane as to the skin; it instantly removes all bad odors; stops all putrescent fermentation; kills microbes more effectually and rapidly than any other antiseptic; cleanses and heals fetid wounds and sores, and hastens healing; it is an ideal antiseptic. Consequently, it appears to me of the utmost importance to make it known, and to draw attention to all the applications that it may be put to both from a domestic point of view for deodorizing and cleaning, and from a medical point of view as an antiseptic and healer par excellence." In referring to ten cases of angina, or coryza washing gargles and applications of Hermetine have given me the best of results. I treated with perfect success a case of incipient diphtheria exclusively with lotions and gargles of the electroized solution."

A Proclamation by the Governor.
\$200 REWARD.
STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.
Whereas, official information has been received at this department that H. C. Womble, late of the county of Wake, stands charged with the murder of Annie Hall, alias Annie Green, and whereas, it appears that the said H. C. Womble has fled the State, or so conceals himself that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him:
Now, therefore, I, Elias Carr, Governor of the State of North Carolina, by virtue of authority in me vested by law, do issue this my Proclamation, offering a reward of Two Hundred dollars for the apprehension and delivery of said H. C. Womble to the Sheriff of Wake county at the courthouse door in Raleigh. And I do enjoin all officers of the State and all good citizens to assist in bringing said criminal to justice.
Done at our city of Raleigh, the 13th day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the one hundred and twenty-first year of our American Independence.
