Experiments With Electrolized Salt The Petit Journal draws attention to a new phase of an important sanitation question. It appears, writes the London Standar'd Paris correspondent, that Dr. Julien Proger, chief surgeon of the Asylum for Deaf and Dumb Children at Asnieres, near Paris, and member of the sanitary council of the departpartment of the Seine, has, for the last four months, been using hermitine as an antiseptic, and that he has now laid the result of his experiments before the Academie de Medicine. It is useful to state how he was led to make those experiments with the electrolised salt water used as a disinfectant in the Royal Victoria Hospital at Netley, and as a deodorizer for the main sewer of Ipswich. M. Consequently, it appears to me of the utmost importance to make it known, and to draw attention to all the applications that it may be put to both from domestic point of view for deodorizing and cleaning, and from a medical point of view as an antiseptic and healer par excellence."
