An Indianapolis special to the Washington Times says: More than 600 delegates to the na-

tional sound money convention have engaged rooms at the various hotels In this city, and the indications are that the hostelries will be crowded to their utmost limit. The local nittee is determined that there shall be no lack of good accommodations, and if the leading hotels prove inadequate well-known citizens will open their homes to the excess.

The program for the convention is taking form. It has been announced that the mass meeting will be held on Wednesday evening in Tomlinson Hall. The admission will be by ticket, and strangers in the city will be favored first. The preliminary session of the convention will be held Wednesday, beginning at noon, and the chief business Thursday, beginning at 10 a. m.

Caffery for Chairman. The important thing Wednesday will be the speech of the temporary chairman. The executive committee cannot yet announce the name of the temporary presiding officer. It looks now as if the selection will not be difinitely made until Monday. It seems pretty certain that Senator Caffery of Louisiana will be permanent chairman. Walter Kessler of this city, the sergeant-at arms for the committee, is engaged in appointing the doorkeepers and assistant sergeants. He will be ready to announce the list of appointments

later in the week. It is proposed that the delegates shall enter by the Market street door, and the men holding stage tickets and the newspaper men by the Delaware street door. The sergeant and his assistants will all wear badges. The sentiment in favor of Senator Vilas for President is growing steadily at headquarters here, and it now looks as if the influence of Indiana in the convention would be exerted in favor of his namination.




