Suit for Heavy Dumages.

Charles H. Norton has returned to Durham from the Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore where he has been for some months under treatment for the severe injury he received in a railroad accident, and has entered suit against the North

Carolina Railroad for damages. He and Mr. A. G. Bauer, of Rateigh, were in a buggy together crossing the railroad track when an east bound train on the North Carolina road struck the buggy.

He claims \$30,000 or \$40,000 damages on the ground that the cars were running at an unusual rate of speed; that the buggy was carried a great distance and that the railroad was careless in leaving a lot of box cars in the way so no one could see the coming train. The railroad people say there was no negligence and that the train was not running rap-

Norton, the Durham Herald says, was so badly hurt that he is injured for life.

Mr. Bauer has not yet brought suit, but it is understood be will also be likely to sue in Durham.

Only the North Carolina railroad has been sued, and not the Southern, which is the lessee of the North Carolina division. It is said this was done to prevent removal of the trial to the Federal court. Fuller, Winston & Fuller represent Mr. Norton and F. H. Busbee, W. A. Guthrie, and Manning & Foushee will represent the railroad.
