FUSION WINS IN WAKE.

Mr. Broughton Led His Ticket.

JIM YOUNG'S SHAVE.

His Majority Will Not Be Over Fifty or Sixty—Populists Scratched Republicans' Names from the County.

The republican ticket has won in the county by majorities ranging from one hundred and more to probably 1,250. Mr. Rogers leads the ticket and Jim Young brought in two precincts, Stony Creek and Swift Creek have not run, but it is not expected that the vote of either will effect the general result in the county.

The vote was very close between Mr. N. B. Broughton and Jim Young and it was not until this afternoon that the democrats gave up. Mr. Broughton made a splendid run.

Jim Young claims the county by 117 votes.

Joe Rogers' majority is estimated by populists to be 1,250.

Jim Young's election is conceded. Swift Creek will probably add something to his majority, while Stony Hill will go against him. His majority will be 60 or 80. The vote against the republicans on the fusion ticket was surprisingly large. Jones and Adams will win by only several hundred majority. The populists did not stand by the republicans at the returns show. They simply did not vote.

Bryan carried the county by about four hundred majority, and Russell carried it by a like number. McKinley carried the township by 181 majority. Watson's plurality was 34.
