 The low pressure has moved eastward and now extends along the Atlantic coast from New England to Florida, with cloudy weather along the southern coast. Light rains occurred at many stations in the Atlantic states, the largest amounts occurring over Florida and Georgia; while in the lake region, where the temperature has fallen below freezing, it was snowing this morning—Marquette, Buffalo and Cleveland report snow.
 The high area and clearing condition has moved southeast to northern Texas and Missouri and now dominates the weather throughout the entire central valley. The temperature has fallen considerably throughout the east, except over Florida, the fall exceeding 20 degrees since yesterday morning from Raleigh to Boston.
