

Washington Notes.

WASHINGTON, April 5, 1897. Senator Jones, of Arkansas, chairman of the democratic national committee, has issued an address endorsing the appeal made by President Black, of the national association of democratic clubs, for a celebration of the 154th anniversary of the birthday of Thomas Jefferson, the author of the declaration of independence and the founder of American democracy, on the 13th day of this month by all democratic organizations.

It really looks as though Speaker Reed really intended to carry out the announced programme of only having the house meet twice a week, on Wednesdays and Saturdays, and adjourn. It may be that he can keep this thing up during the two or three months that the senate will take to pass the tariff bill, but many are predicting that he will have to give the house a chance to do something or it will do something in spite of him.

The Greensboro Record of yesterday says: It has been rumored around the city and elsewhere recently that the McAdoo House was to be closed up—that it was not paying expenses, etc. It is a difficult matter to find out the truth of it, though for the best information obtainable it seems such a step has not been fully decided upon, yet something is going on regarding the matter, exactly what we do not know. It is probable some change will be made this week.
