

Washington Notes.

WASHINGTON, May 3, 1897.

The democratic members of the senate finance committee very properly declined to agree to the proposition to allow the amended tariff bill to be reported to the senate as soon as the republicans have finished work upon it, which they say will be this week.

The democratic members of the committee do not expect to be able to get the bill changed in committee, nor do they desire to unnecessarily delay either its report to the senate or its reaching a final vote, but they insist upon taking time enough to go over the bill, which has been so extensively changed that it is practically a new one, in order to acquaint themselves sufficiently with it to inform their colleagues in the senate, and the country, why they oppose it, before it is reported to the senate.

It is believed that the action of the Pension Commissioner Evans, in calling for the resignation of every Democratic chief of division in the pension bureau, to take effect May 1st, indicates what will be done in all the other departments with the chiefs and other high salaried positions.

The democratic employees of the treasury department who are not so unsophisticated as to expect to be protected by the civil service commission are preparing to "get it in the neck." A committee has been appointed to investigate all the bureaus of the treasury department and to report a plan of reorganization that will enable the most efficient employees to get the largest salaries. That sounds all right, doesn't it? But every wide awake democrat knows that the plan reported will give the biggest salaries to the republicans, and is preparing to take his dose of reduction with as good grace as he can, if he isn't in a position to show his disgust by resigning when the reorganization is made.

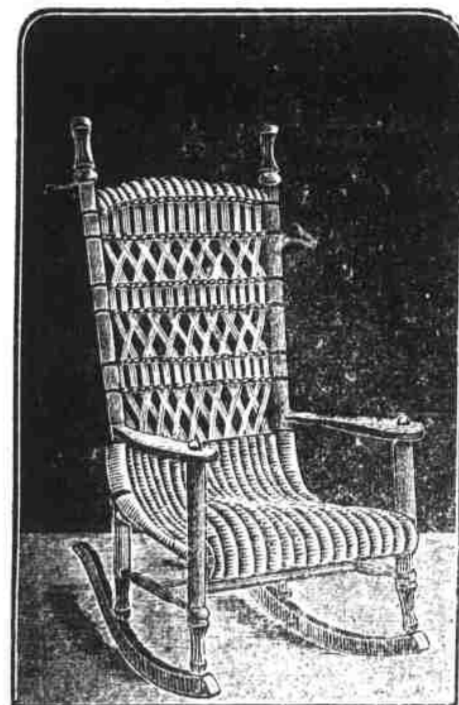

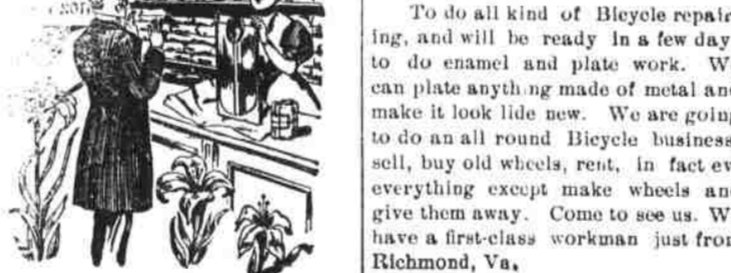
