Monday will be memorial day and it is hoped that our people will turn out en masse to do bonor to the sac red and time honored anniversary loving hearts, both old and young, together to lay with gentle hands beautiful flowers upon the graves of the heroes who sleep in Oakwood Let a large attendance and copious floral offerings pay tribute on Monday to the efforts of the Ladies' Memorial Association to keep green the memories of those heroes.

The retirement by the new board of aldermen of Capt. Charles D. Heartt, who has for more than a double decade been the faithful, efficient and satisfactory Chief of police of this city will cause deep regret throughout the entire public of Raleigh. As a man his character and record among his feilow citizens have been such as to win for him their fullest confidence and esteem, and in his official capacity his administration of the duties of his position has been such as to command the honor and respect of all classes of people to a degree and uniformity that has probably never marked the record of any official in the State. The announcement that he will be seen no more in his accustomed place will be one full of sore disappointment to the people of this city. It is prabably not within our province to criticise the action of the board, but we do not exaggerate when we say that his retention in his declining days in the place, to the faithful discharge of the duties of which he has given the best years of his manhood, would have afforded more gratification to the people of Raleigh them the settlement of any question which has characterized this entire campaign.

The signing of the Greater New York charter by Governor Black makes the great metropolis of 3,000,000 inhapitants, which has been so long talked of an accomplished fact. The citizens of that great city are confronted at once with the task of providing it with a government which will enter upon its powers on the coming first of January, and will remain in control for four years. The importance of their meeting this demand upon their civic virtue and intelligence as it should be met cannot be overthe nost memorable and momentous in the annals of city government in America and will attract widespread attention and interest.
