THE VETERANS AT NASHVILLE.

The official programme for the reunion of the United Confederate Veterans at Nashville, Tenn., June 22, 23 and 24 has been announced. This gathering of old veterans promises to be the largest ever held in the South. Col. George Mooreman, assistant adjutant general, announces that nine hundred and seventy-five camps of United Confederate Veterans have been organized, and that about one hundred applications for the organization of camps are now pending. Texas heads the list with two hundred and twenty-one camps, while Alabama and North Carolina follow with ninety-one camps each. Maryland has six camps, Virginia thirty-seven, West Virginia seventeen and the District of Columbia one. The following is the programme for the Nashville reunion. Tuesday, June 22, at 10 a. m. the Daughters of the Confederacy will meet at the State capitol in Nashville in a general reunion. On the evening of the same day they will give a reception to the Confederate Veterans. At 12 m. on the same day the convention of Confederate Camps will hold a session in the large tabernacle. Each division will be assigned to its own position. Speeches of welcome will then be made and responses. Hon. J. W. Reagan is orator of the occasion, and immediately upon the close of his address will come the usual organization for transaction of business. For Wednesday, June 23, the convention will meet at 10 a. m. and will transact important business which will come before it, requiring a full day's session. The evening will be devoted to a concert, which will be given in honor of the sponsors and maids of honor. They will be seated upon the platform, with special escort of Confederate Veterans. For Thursday, June 24, the grand parade. Gen. W. H. Jackson, chief marshal of the division, will be in charge. All divisions will be assigned positions and each camp will carry a banner or old Confederate battle flag, which will be still more appropriate. The sponsors and maids of honor from the different States will ride in open carriages in front of their own State division. The reunion will close with a general reception that night.

The New Orleans papers announce that the Illinois Central Railroad Company has determined to go on with its terminal improvements in that city without awaiting the result of an application for a rehearing in the case recently decided adversely to the company by the Supreme Court of Louisiana. Commenting, the Picayune says: "It was announced when the Stuyvesant docks decision was first rendered that the Illinois Central would do nothing more in the matter of improving its facilities until a final decision was reached settling beyond dispute and appeal its right to operate free wharves, etc., but it has reconsidered its action and will go on with the work. It will extend its wharves along the entire river front of its

property and cover them with a system of sheds so as to protect merchandise and labor. It will erect the necessary warehouses, build another million-bushel elevator and make other suggested improvements. When these are completed New Orleans will have caught up with all that New York and other rival cities have done during the interval when the hands of the Illinois Central Railroad were tied by the Supreme Court decision.
