

FOR LYNCHING

Wife of Ex-Congressman William H. Felton of Georgia, Makes a Sensational Speech.

At a meeting of the Georgia Agricultural Society, at Tybee Island, Tuesday last, Mrs. William Felton, of Cartersville, wife of ex-Congressman Felton, and member of the board of lady managers of the Columbian Exposition, being chairwoman of the agricultural committee, made a sensational speech. The subject of her address was "The Woman on the Farm," but she concluded by giving her almost unqualified endorsement to lynching for certain crimes. In this connection she said: "Wake up, men of Georgia, to the crisis now upon you! These white girls are the coming mothers of the white race. In the sight of Heaven, I bring this note of warning and entreaty to you. What means all this lynching in our borders? You never heard of it in years past and gone. If you have one obligation in life before and beyond any other, it is your duty to motherhood. I hear much of the millions sent away to Brazil, China, India and Mexico for foreign missions; I feel that there are heathen at home—close at hand who need much attention."

"We must make an effort to stop lynching by keeping closer over poor white girls on secluded farms, and if these poor maidens are destroyed in a land that their fathers died to save I say the shame lies with the people who fail to be protectors for the children of their dead comrades. I simply say the heathen are at your door, when our young maidens are destroyed in sight of your opulence and magnificence and when your temples of justice are put to shame by lynchings' ropes. If your courthouses are shams and frauds and the law's delay is the villain's bulwark, then I say let judgment begin at the house of God and redeem this country from the cloud of shame that rests upon it, when there is not enough religion in the pulpits to organize a crusade against sin, nor enough justice in the court-houses to promptly punish crime, nor manhood enough in the nation to put a sheltering arm about innocence and virtue."

"If it needs lynching to protect a woman's dearest possession from human beasts, then I say lynch a thousand times a week if necessary. The poor girl would choose death in preference to such ignominy, and I say a quick rope to assassinate! The crying need of women on the farm is security."

"Strong, able-bodied men have told me that they have quit farming because their women folks were scared to death if left on the place. Such things are a public reproach and the best part of God's creation is trembling and crying for protection at home. And I say, with due respect to all who listen to me, that as long as your politicians take the colored man into their embrace on election day and make him think he is a man and brother, so long will lynching prevail, because the cause of it will grow and increase, for familiarity breeds contempt."

NOTICE OF ELECTION.

Under and by virtue of a resolution of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Raleigh, passed July 15th, 1897, in pursuance of the authority given in Chapter 129, Private Laws of 1893, entitled "An Act to authorize the City of Raleigh to issue bonds for public improvements," and to levy a special tax," notice is hereby given that a special election will be held at the various polling places in the wards of the said City on the 7th day of September, 1897, for the purpose of obtaining the consent of a majority of the qualified voters of said City to the issuance of the bonds provided for in Sections 1 and 5 of said Act, as follows:

Sec. 1. That for the purpose of paving, macadamizing and otherwise improving such of the public streets of the city of Raleigh as the board of aldermen of said city may determine to improve, and for making such other public improvements as the said board of aldermen may determine to make, the city of Raleigh is hereby authorized and empowered to issue its bonds to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, of such denominations and in such proportions as the board of aldermen may deem advisable, bearing interest from the date thereof at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum, with interest coupons attached, payable half-yearly, at such times and at such place or places as may be deemed advisable by said board of aldermen; said bonds to be of such form and tenor and transferable in such way, and the principal thereof payable or redeemable at such time or times, not exceeding thirty years from the date thereof, and at such place or places as the board of aldermen may determine.

Sec. 5. "That for the purpose of providing for the payment of the interest accruing on and the principal at maturity of the bonds issued under the authority of this act the board of aldermen of said City shall annually, and at the time of levying other City taxes, levy and lay a particular tax on all persons and subjects of taxation on which the said board of aldermen now are or may hereafter be authorized to lay and levy taxes for any purpose whatsoever, said particular tax to be not less than six or more than eight cents on the one hundred dollars assessed valuation on property, and not less than eighteen nor more than twenty-four cents on each taxable poll. The taxes provided for in this section shall be collected, and shall be accounted for and kept separate from other city taxes, and shall be applied exclusively to the purposes for which they are collected. So much of said taxes as may be required to pay the interest on the bonds issued by authority of this act, as it falls due, and cannot be applied to the purchase or discharge of the bonds for which said taxes are levied and collected, shall be invested so as to secure the payment at maturity of the principal of the said bonds; and to insure the due investment of the amounts collected from year to year in excess of that required to pay the said interest the board of aldermen shall cause the said excess to be turned over to the commissioner of the sinking fund of the city of Raleigh, whose duty it shall be under such general rules and regulations shall from time to time prescribe, to make investments of so much of the taxes collected and turned over to him as aforesaid to the payment of the principal of said bonds issued under this act, and to do or perform all such other services in connection with said bonds as said board of aldermen may prescribe, and such commissioner shall give bond and receive such compensation for his said services as said board of aldermen may determine.

Those qualified voters approving the issue of the bonds and the levy and collection of the particular taxes as above provided for shall deposit in the ballot box a slip containing the printed or written word "Approved," and those disapproving the same shall deposit a like slip with the printed or written word "Disapproved."

That for the purpose of holding said election, a new registration has been duly ordered, to be held at the usual voting places in said City at the times, and in the manner and between the hours as provided for in the general election law, beginning Saturday, July 31st, 1897.

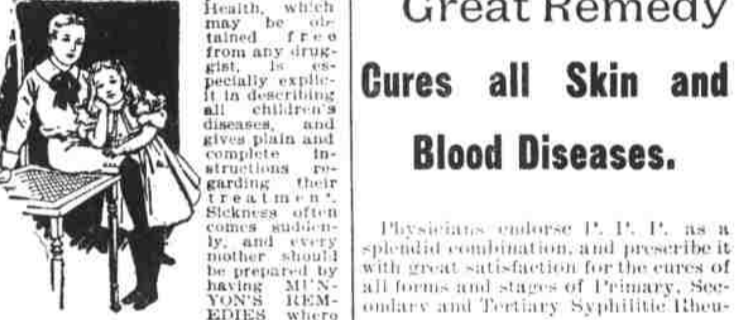
