Secretary Gage has made the firs experiment with the Tarsney law providing for the competition of architects in the design of public buildings by inviting seven archi tects to submit competitive designs and estimates for the Norfolk, Va building, for which there is an appropriation of \$190,000. It is the intention of the Secretary also to invite architects to submit plans for the new Ellis Island immigrant station at New York, which is to cost \$500,000.

The Farmers' National Congress is in session in the hall of the House of Representatives of Minnesota, at St. Paul. Notwith. standing this scarcity of wheat for home consumption England has exported a small quantity of wheat to France during this present mouth. This is said to be due to the artificial stimulation of the French market by speculators, woo, it is said, are undertaking to corner the wheat market in that country.
