WE WEDNESDAY Sept. 9

In a letter to the Manufacturers Record the Yazoo Delta Railway Co. states that four new lines of this line are now completed and in operation. The company proposes to complete the road from Morehead, on the Southern Railway, to Dublin on the Yazoo & Mississippi Valley Railroad a distance of forty-four miles. About 400 men are now engaged in constructing the line, and it is estimated to complete eight miles and about twenty-two miles in all by September 10.

The marine hospital service at Washington is not inclined to concede that the fever at present prevalent at Ocean Springs, Mass., is yellow fever. The place is near Boston and has a summer population of some 3,000. There have been some 600 cases of the fever, which at first was mild and has since become virulent. It is described by some persons as dengue, but State boards of health of Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi pronounce it yellow fever. There is some pain in the Southwest in consequence. It is to be hoped that efficient measures will be taken to prevent the extension of the pestilence.

According to a Lenox dispatch Prince Alexander George, son of the Duke of Teck and brother-in-law of the Duke of York, is about to visit Brookhurst, Mass., as a guest of Mr. Barwell Hoffman. The Prince has had his turn in the army and service; it is said, in the Malabar war, but his chief title to distinction, it seems, is that he is the son of a father who is "claimed" by the socialists of England as one of their own. This circumstance is supposed to connect the Duke with democracy, which is European, not very clearly distinguished from socialism, since a large proportion of European democrats are also socialists.

The interesting announcement is made that "General Prosperity" has reached Fredericksburg, Va., that pleasant and historic city on the Rappahannock. A dispatch states that the Washington woolen mills, of that city, one of the largest industrial enterprises in the Rappahannock Valley, has voluntarily increased the pay of all its employees 10 per cent. So full are the mills with orders that the samples have been called in, as it will take nearly six months to fill the orders now booked. One year ago these mills were shut down, but the triumph of sound money put the wheels in motion, and now they are able to advance the wages of their men.

The annual convention of the National Association of Postoffice Clerks, which met in Baltimore this week should receive the public sympathy and encouragement in its efforts to secure the passage by Congress of a law to put the post-office clerks into the classified service object in view is to improve the postal service by so classifying clerks as to get better results from

their work; in a word, by introducing system and business methods into this branch of federal administration and grading the men according to merit and fitness. Their demand for a classified service is in public interest and should receive the public endorsement and support. Congress should also recognize the fact that many of these clerks are poorly paid for the important and arduous duties they perform and the ability demanded for their performance. Postmaster Warfield's suggestions on the subject are practical, and, with the co-operation of business interests, it is not improbable that sufficient pressure may be brought to bear on Congress to induce it to give effect to this greatly needed reform.
