Price 25 cc way pooling, President Chauncey M. Depew, of the New York Central railroad, is quoted as saving that, it his opinion there can be no substantial prosperity in this country unti-

the railroads prosper, and he does not see how the rangoads, can pross they write about per if an interminable rate war is to be waged between them. "The railroad business of the last six months has been done on the basis of a demoralized rate," continued

Mr. Depew, 'and while the mercasin earnings every where has been great, you will notice that it has been greatest in gross earnings rather than net. You must under stand, too, that these earnings havfollowed a tremender's baryest here and an equally great even movement, induced by the wheat demands of Europe upon us. Some statesmen tell us that a pooling law is too great a power to contra me in the hands of any public commission but the absence of one is touding on the one band to create a middleman's and consumer, and at the same time to destroy the main hope of prosperity for the railroads. You take the great freight shippers of the country and you will find them owning their own freight cars, and thereby get ting mileage rates with which no ladividual shipper who has to pay regular rates can compete. The big shipper now goes to the western farm with his private freight cars. states the price that he will give for be, and then, having dictates to the farmer the selling price, he turns around and in the same way distates to the railroad the banding price This is the situation which exists to a large extent today, and to which we are steadily drifting.

"Now," continued Mr Depew. "prosperity, if it means anything at all, means the distribution of wealth. among the many and over a large territory. It certainly does not mean the concentration of wealth and lower in a few hauds and in a few large cities. The pooling legislation which the railroads are now seeking would establish a uniform rate throughout the country and bring us back to the oid conditions when the farmer shipped his produce direct to the sales market and Lased his selling price on natura conditions rather than on the abi trary rate fixed for him by a monopoly. Our populist friends in the West see in the pooling bill some benefit to the railroads, and for that reason they oppose it, ignoring the fact that it is of far greater benefit to the farming interests of the country. FARMERS DIFFER IN OPINION.

Now is the best time to sow Annual Clover Seed. In the busk they are surer and bet-ter crop than Cleaned Seed. If ground is baked between your cotton and corn rows, ran over very lightly with cultivator and sow broadcast thrily of cleaned or sixty pounds of seed in the busk.

The month of September is the proper time to sow all grasses. Small plots should be spaced deep, and belief should be broken with two-horse ploughs, and thoroughly pulcerized with disc and harrow.
