New York, Feb 12 The big Netherlands American poat, Veendam, of Otterdam, from New York, was lost at sea February 6th, and the American liner, St. Louis, brought her passengers and crew safely into port today. She had carried nine cabin, 118 steerage passengers and a crew of eighty five

The Veendam was rated at an iron screw triple expansion en gine. She was three days out when she struck the wreck.

The passengers of the St. Louis passed resolutions, commending the gallant service and splendel sea manship displayed by the others and crew in rescuing the Vicendeems passengers and crew.
