TWO QUARANTINED.

An Epidemic of Smallpox is Now Feared at Salisbury.

As mentioned Saturday a negro who had small pox stayed one night recently at a camp in this county on the Mocksville-Mooresville road.

The next moning be discovered that the disease had broken out on bim and he set out for Charlotte without telling any one his troubles. But he soon got down and is now one of the small pox patients near Charlotte.

When the fact that the camp had entertained a victim of small pox became known there was general alarm. The sick negro had stayed in a house with two men the night before be broke out

The county health superintend ent, Dr. John Whitehead, decided to take prompt action against the spead of the disease in Rowan, so yesterday he went to the camp, accompanied by Drs. McKenzie and Brown. The doctors vaccinated about thirty people-all they could find about the camp, both white and colored.

The two negroes who were exposed to the disease by sleeping in the house with the sick man, were ordered to stay in a house to themselves, and guards were sent up today to remain with them.

Dr. Whitehead says there is great danger now of the disease reaching Salisbury and he urges everybody to vaccinate. - Salisbury Sun.
