### HOLDERS OF SPANISH BONDS

Are Alarmed Over Important Financial News From Madrid.

London, Feb. 24.—The Evening News says the holders of Spanish bonds are greatly alarmed at the serious news received from Spain to the effect that the Bank of Spain will only take coupons due on April 1st with recourse.

Anglo-Spanish bankers say it means that the Government has not put the bank in a position to redeem the coupons. If the bank is not indemnified by the Government, parties who have obtained money will have to repay it.

This, the bankers believe, is a grave situation, and indicates government embarrassments. The bank is safeguarding itself, and will not guarantee that coupons will be paid.

Possibly they will be paid in paper instead of gold. Bondholders are also fearful that a tax will be put upon coupons, or that the discount will be reduced.

Leading Anglo-Spanish firms say there is a great question whether Spain will meet coupons integrally. A heavy fall in Spanish exchange is strong evidence of the difficulties of the Government.

### YESTERDAY IN CONGRESS

Corbett Contested Election Case in Senate—House Discusses Quarantine.

Washington, Feb. 24.—The case of contested election was discussed in the Senate today, after Senator Allen had withdrawn his bill and voted in favor of the appropriation bill, and in discussion yesterday.

The House today considered the \$300,000 Civil Appropriation bill, discussing the question of quarantines. Senator Bailey of Texas, moving to amend the appropriation of money as far as to limit the President to the use of it only in connection with State health officials.

He said he would prefer that no people should be afflicted with the plague rather than that the States should be stripped of the powers they ought to possess and exercise.

Other Southern Democrats who have experienced and suffered from the "shotgun" quarantines, favored the amendment as reported, and it was agreed to by the narrow margin of 72 to 72.

During the discussion Mr. Corbett warned the Republicans that they must attend the sessions regularly, in order against Democrats holding extraneous appropriations on the country in order to be able during the campaign to point to Republican extravagance.

Historic and Valued Relics of the Revolution.

We were shown yesterday two ancient and historic relics of the Revolutionary war. They were a copy of the ritual of the church of England, printed in 1758, and in it are entries made of which were carried by Dr. Donaldson Cooke during the war of the Revolution. Dr. Cooke was the great-grandfather of Mrs. A. E. Stronach, of this city, who served with honor and distinction in that conflict. He died in 1783, and is buried in the old cemetery of St. John's Church. All the entries which are taken from Dr. Cooke as far back as found, after being wounded in the engagement. The pockets of the ritual case are filled with the small pieces which still contain the drugs of the period in them. Their singular state of preservation through all these years is most remarkable. The case, which is covered with a special quality of leather, does not begin to show its age.

The copy of the ritual of the church of England contains a record of the marriage of Dr. Cooke's son, Dr. Wm. Priscilla, which occurred 146 years ago, in 1768. The dates of the birth of the children are also recorded.

The relics are of great value from a historic standpoint, and the descendants of the distinguished persons who used them, may well be proud of the fact that they are in their possession.

### SAM JONES WITHDRAWS

Atlanta, Ga., Feb. 24.—The Rev. Sam Jones has withdrawn from the state senatorial contest, but declares that he reserves the right to present it at some time he sees fit.

He gives as his reason for withdrawing now, the "lack of elements" in the State Democratic forces. He says that in former campaigns they have given themselves to the whiskey element, and he has no assurance that this omission will be an exception.

He also says that he does not care to endorse the "variegated" or "chili-pepper" platform—a step which would be rendered necessary should his candidacy as a Democrat be continued just now.


