SHOWERS TOMORROW.

The Weather Bureau Promises Another Rain Tuesday. For Raleigh and vicinity the forecast of the weather bureau says: Increasing cloudiness to night; showers Tuesday.

The weather is fair and warm over the south Atlantic States and in the Ohio valley, elsewhere generally cloudy and rainy weather prevails. One storm is central off New England, which has caused light rains in the east Lake region, and north Atlantic, and a new storm is central over Arkansas, which is causing threatening weather with rain throughout the entire country west of the Mississippi. The weather is cooler in the Lake region and northwest.
