Dr D W C Pattison, of Washington was made Chairman of the Committee on Arrangements, and Dr C H A Kleinsmidt, Secretary. Dr Grissom, Chairman, conducted the discussion of the report and displayed considerable parliamentary knowledge and presence of mind in pushing the questions to a vote. His action was approved by the delegates.

Unveiling the Statue.

RICHMOND, VA, May 23.—Besides the uniformed troops from many Southern States who have signified intention of being present at the unveiling of the Equestrian statue of General Lee many veteran organizations will be in line from Maryland, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana and Texas.

While orders in regard to the parade and programme of exercises have not yet been issued it is understood that the uniformed troops and veterans will be given position in the line in the order in which their States seceded. This will put South Carolina first. The uniformed troops will be under the command of Brig. Gen Charles J Anderson, of Virginia. It has been determined to have vocal and instrumental music at the unveiling of the statue. The hymn "How firm a foundation" will be sung by the vast assemblage with a full brass band accompaniment.

A private telegram received here from New York announces the arrival in that city from Europe of Miss Mary Lee, eldest daughter of the late General R E Lee.

Death of Rev. J. E. Mann, D. D.

The announcement by telegram from Hon D W Bain, that this distinguished divine had died from typhoid fever in St Louis on Friday last, has cast a deep gloom over our entire State. Dr Mann was one of the delegates from North Carolina to the General Conference at St Louis. At the time of his death he was about sixty years old, and had been in the North Carolina Conference since 1853. During his ministry he was pastor at Fayetteville, Goldsboro, Greensboro and Wilmington, and presiding elder on the Washington, Warrenton and New Berne districts.
