Emperor William has started on a shooting tour in East Prussia.

The suspension of Henry S. Godet & Co., was announced on the New York Stock Exchange yesterday.

The Grand Opera House in Memphis, Tenn., was opened last night by the Emma Juch Opera Company.

The Italian societies of Baltimore Tuesday celebrated the anniversary of the entry of the Italians into Rome.

The steamers arriving at New York Tuesday were the Arizona, from Liverpool, and the Anchoris, from Glasgow.

Mrs. Mary. Alana Whitten, of West port, Me., aged 16, shot herself dead Sunday night. She had been married only three months.

The Comptroller of the Currency has authorized the Union National Bank, of Atlantic City, N. J., to commence business, with a capital of \$100,000.

The liquidators of the Cape of Good Hope Bank reported that the deficit in addition to the total loss of the fully paid up capital and reserve fund, amounts to £411,000.

The Oakland Bank, Chicago, suspended payment Tuesday morning, an assignment having been made to William L. Moss. The liabilities are stated to be \$80,000 and the nominal assets \$75,000.

The Rev. Frank Forsythe, a Methodist Episcopal clergyman, who was summarily dismissed from his church at Rockland, N. Y., for playing base ball, has established an independent charge at that place, and is to have a big benefit, for which the attraction is a game of ball, in which the pastor will play.

It is reported from Mitchellville, N. Y., that on Monday evening Mrs. John Beam, of that place, gave birth to twins; that on the same evening Mrs. Stratton, her daughter, who lives in a neighboring township, was also blessed with twins; and at a later hour the same evening, Mrs. Stratton's daughter gave birth to twins. So the grandmother, daughter and granddaughter collectively contributed six children to the population the same evening.
