

Board of Aldermen.

An adjourned meeting of the board of Aldermen was held last night. The committee on the auditorium reported that it would be best to authorize them to receive bids for the building and select the site. It was moved and adopted that parties having suitable sites communicate with the board so that options might be taken.

A telegram was read from Mr. Jno. C. George, of Baltimore, stating that he would be in Raleigh next Wednesday.

The Rex hospital committee made the following report :

Resolved 1st, That the question of the location of the Rex hospital be referred to Mr. R. H. Battle, Mr. R. T. Gray and the city attorney to assertain if the land left by John Rex can be or should be sold for the purpose of securing a more eligible location.

Resolved 2d. That the committee on the part of the board of Aldermen recommend that the city appropriate annually two thousand dollars towards the maintenance of the hospital.

Resolved 3d. That the joint meeting of the trustees of the Rex fund and the committee on the part of the board of Aldermen urge that prompt and vigorous action be taken with the view of an early establishment of the Rex hospital.

Adopted at joint meeting March. 17th, 1891.


#### Youth's Companion.
